Attendance

Grading Policies:

Final grade is composed of:

- Homework = 10%
- Tests/Projects = 50%
- Quizzes/Classwork = 40%

Homework

- It is expected that students will complete homework to the best of their ability, in its entirety, and bring it to class the day it is due.
- On evenings when written homework is not assigned, students are to review notes, readings, and online resources.

Quizzes/Tests

 An assessment of this format should be expected upon the completion of each topic/unit.

Projects/classwork

- Some class time will be allotted for work on projects. Students should expect to complete the majority of the project work outside of the classroom.
- Classwork opportunities will be presented on a daily basis. These will
 often times be in the form of a writing assignment.

Late/missing assignments:

- Assignments are to be turned in on, or before, the scheduled due date. Extenuating circumstances require a signed and dated note from a parent/legal guardian to be excused. (Extenuating circumstances include medical emergency or death in the family.) Late assignments will be accepted up to two days following the initial due date. Each day the assignment is late there is a 10 point penalty. No assignments will be accepted after the two day grace period. This is nonnegotiable. If a student knows of a scheduled absence, then they are still accountable for work due during that time (i.e. projects, quizzes, tests, homework).
- For an excused absence, a student is allowed 5 school days to make up missed assignments. If the assignments are not turned in within that window of time, the student will earn a grade of 0 for the missing assignments.
- Ultimately, it is the student's responsibility to find out what work needs to be completed and to get it turned in by the appointed time. I will not track them down to make sure that they follow through.

Extra Credit

 There will be no extra credit. Students need to make the most of every opportunity given.
